SAL Clean Team



This summer SAL launched its newest program, SAL Clean Team! This program is made possible by San Mateo County Supervisor Warren Slocum and Sheriff Greg Munks.

Clean Team leaders spend Wednesday afternoons cleaning Middlefield Road and reaching out to local residents and merchants. All graffiti, illegal dumping and large trash items are reported weekly to Code Enforcement and Recycle Works. Weekly logs are also submitted to Supervisor Slocum's office.



Green Team

Clean Team mentors a younger Green Team on Thursdays to clean local target areas and attend field trips and presentations by various guest speakers.



Webcasting

The SAL Webcasting program was created to teach youth about digital arts and webcasting. Additionally, participants will gain hands on experience with video and film production. Throughout the duration of the program, students will conduct interviews, film live footage, and create their very own videos.



Over the course of the summer, the youth have learned how to use Final Cut Pro and are working on editing the videos they have produced. Some of the video topics include: an Interview with Deputy Dan Young and a zombie apocalypse survival video. The group recently went on a field trip to Facebook to observe an interview with Malala Yousafzai.

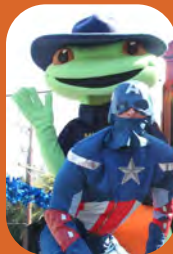
Fall Programs

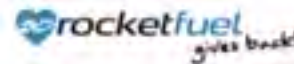
