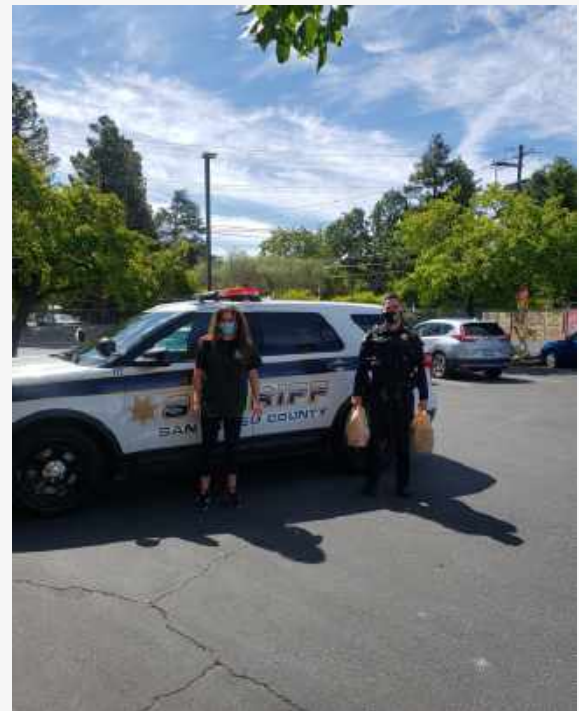


## CLOTHING AND DIAPER DISTRIBUTION
